- 3 Calculated Lake Value shows what the total effluent concentration looks like once it has fully mixed in the receiving waterbody. This value is calculated as a dissolved concentration for an appropriate comparison to the numeric water quality criteria, which are also in the dissolved form. Consistent with Georgia EPD, non-detectable effluent concentrations are not translated into calculated lake values.
- 4 Numeric Water Quality Criteria is the maximum concentration of a parameter (calculated at a default hardness of 50 mg/L as calcium carbonate) established for the receving waterbody that will be protective of the designated use per Georgia EPD's rules and regulations. Calculated Lake Values less than these criteria are protective of the waterbody.
- Numeric water quality criterion shown is for Hexavalent Chromium.
- The numeric water quality criterion shown is the chronic (long-term) water quality criterion for selenium since this parameter does not have an acute (short-term) water quality criterion. The selenium water quality criterion is compared to the average in lake concentration, which for April was calculated as 1.64 ug/L.
